Ohio Revised Code Section 3109.042 Custody Rights of Unmarried Mother

"An unmarried female who gives birth to a child is the sole residential parent and legal custodian of the child until a court of competent jurisdiction issues an order designating another person as the residential parent and legal custodian. A court designating the residential parent and legal custodian of a child described in this section shall treat the mother and father as standing upon an equality when making the designation."

IF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO YOU:

- 1. You are a woman who gave birth to a child while you were unmarried; and
- 2. No court has ever granted custody of that child to another person.

THE FOLLOWING IS TRUE:

- 1. You have legal custody of that child and you are the residential parent (meaning you have the right to have your child live with you).
- 2. You have the legal right to control <u>all aspects</u> of your child's life, including visitation by your child with any person, including the father or a man you believe to be the father.
- 3. It is <u>not necessary</u> to file a Custody Complaint in Juvenile Court to obtain legal custody of your child. You already have legal custody pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3109.042.
